Chairman's update.

In early March I was delighted to attend the official opening of our new Plumbing World branch in Papamoa in the Bay of Plenty, and we had an amazing turnout and show of support from our shareholder members in the region. It's been a few years since we've had an outlet in Papamoa, so the opportunity to now take advantage of the recent growth in this area, and to relieve some of the pressure on our Tauranga and Mt Maunganui branches will be a real plus for both our customers and our staff.

The co-operative had a strong March quarter, which together with three solid previous quarters in the financial year will translate into a positive year-end earnings result and rebate dividend for our ordinary shareholder members. Equally, we expect that momentum to continue in the near term as we continue to refine our customer service offering and grow our footprint throughout the country.

The new financial year will also see further crucial investment by both Plumbing World and Metrix as we look to build our resilience and capability through the introduction of new and improved technologies including our mobile app and commercial quoting system. The need to embrace our digital future is vital for both companies, however it's important to note that the cost of this future is not insignificant, and it will undoubtedly place

pressure on our earnings in the short to medium term.

In February we had some changes to our NZPM Board of Directors with the resignation of Mr Craig Coxhead for personal reasons, and the subsequent appointment of Ms Ngaire Mansfield. Craig has served on the NZPM Board since 2014 and we wish him well for the future. Ngaire as most of you will be aware, was our very first Future Governance Programme appointee back in 2017, and we now welcome her to the Board as an Appointed Director through to the 2020 AGM.

The next couple of months will also be busy as we open our NZPM Future Governance Programme applications, and based on the success of the last two years we'll again be looking to appoint two candidates to the programme in 2019. This is a great opportunity for shareholder members who want to be involved in the future governance of the co-operative to participate in our Board meetings, and also to receive some professional governance training and mentoring to help develop their skills.

June will also see the start of our annual roadshows for members at our now 50 branches across New Zealand, and Rob Kidd and my fellow Directors look forward to seeing as many of you as possible at your local event. As with last year we're looking to

keep the presentation segment succinct, so that we've got as much time as possible to answer any questions and to hear your views and feedback on the co-operative.

And finally, later in this edition of Connector is an article about some of the work NZPM is involved with in the wider community. Concern for the community is one of our seven core co-operative principles, and in addition to the national support we provide for our three key cancer charities, it's fantastic to see the huge number of community based organisations that both our members and our staff regularly assist at a local level.

The Trade Purchasing App is currently being branch tested with customer orders in six branches across the country. The App will enable you or your staff to purchase product from any location utilising your mobile device. You will be able to select product, add an order number and provide a delivery address, saving you valuable time (unless

of course you want to come into the store to pick the order up).



Obituary - Paul Cowan.



In early April we were saddened to hear of the loss of one of our former NZPM staff stalwarts Paul Cowan, who passed away aged 81.

Paul started his plumbing career with Shand Brothers in Palmerston North in 1961, and he joined the co-operative management team with our acquisition of Shand Brothers in 1964. He was our first Secretary/ Accountant, then Finance Manager, General Manager, CEO and finally Managing Director up to his retirement in 1998. In his latter role Paul also served on the NZPM Board as an Executive Director from 1993-1998.

Paul also excelled on the rugby field, playing fullback for Manawatu, and he was well respected by his staff and colleagues throughout the industry and wider community. Upon his retirement in 1998 Paul commented "The formula adopted 30 years ago has quite naturally been subject to variation. However the health of the plumbing industry is still our prime concern. Within this general guideline the board has had to be flexible and changes have taken place within the original principles".
