Chair update.

What an incredibly crazy and saddening couple of months we've seen, particularly during March, with the spread of COVID-19 creating a deadly worldwide pandemic, and as I write this, New Zealand with an increasing number of confirmed cases and now in the early stages of a Level 4 Alert. Whilst a number of our customers are still operating as 'essential services', many of our members businesses will undoubtedly be significantly impacted by the trading restrictions imposed, and as a co-operative we'll continue to work with our shareholders during these turbulent times.

Obviously both Plumbing World and Metrix are also severely affected by this sudden reduction in customer demand, which has resulted in our business virtually shutting down for at least the next four weeks. This will create a significant drop in both our revenue and profit, and whilst we don't expect this to impact on the level of dividend we pay on our redeemable preference shares, it is likely to mean that a lower than previously anticipated rebate dividend will be declared on our ordinary shares for the current financial year. Fortunately, the work we've done over the last 18 to 24 months sees the co-operative in good financial health, with a strong balance sheet, and with the resilience and flexibility to weather this event. The investment we've made in digital and technology solutions will also stand us in good stead, and due to the foresight of our management team we have a good level of stock in both Metrix and Plumbing World to support our customer's needs over the forthcoming months.

So, as we navigate these new and unprecedented times in New Zealand, we'll continue to operate the business in the most effective and efficient manner, with the best interests of the co-operative paramount in our thinking. To underpin this, we've engaged Richard Westlake the founder of Westlake Governance to carry out a review of both the Board and Executive team over the next few weeks. Many of you will have heard Richard speak at our AGM last August about governance in the co-operative sector, and how sound board leadership and direction for the business will become increasingly important as we grow and develop our vision of being a 100-year co-operative.

To continue that process of developing our governance capability, we'll again be running our NZPM Future Governance Programme in 2020, and applications are now open through until 17th July for up to two shareholder members to participate. We're seeking applicants who have a strong

interest in the future governance of the co-operative, and who also demonstrate the core attributes for development and mentoring as potential future directors. ▶



This is a fantastic opportunity to learn more about your board and how they operate, and at the same time receive some professional training as a company director.

Finally, whilst we're all obviously hopeful of a return to at least some level of normality after the next few weeks, I urge all of our members to look at their own business restart plans carefully,

and to consider a scenario where we may be in lockdown (or a restricted state) for longer, and where commerce may take significantly longer than expected to return to sustainable levels. For those working in the construction market, the risks associated with working for companies and developers with the thin balance sheets frequently seen in this sector are huge. Managing your creditors, debtors and cashflow

carefully over the forthcoming period will be critical to your resilience.

During the course of the Governments Level 4 COVID-19 national lockdown, Plumbing World are able to continue providing product for essential / emergency service work.

While our branches remain shut, you are able to utilise our call-out service to access product you need for undertaking emergency work — please refer to the communication we sent you on Tuesday 24th March and again on Friday 27th March where we outline what constitutes emergency work and then access the call-out service by ringing your branch manager directly on their mobile phone.

If you don't have their mobile number already loaded on your phone, or for some reason can't get hold of the branch manager, please go to www.plumbingworld. co.nz and click on the "on-call request" tab which will take you through to your branch and either the manager's mobile number or another person from the branch.

Please also follow us on our Facebook page 'Plumbing World NZ' for up-to-date COVID-19 information as well.

We are also anticipating that beyond April 22nd, there may be

further restrictions such as;

- · A possible extension of Level 4
- A drop to Level 3 which may still incur a number of travel and other restrictions imposed by the government
- A drop to Level 2 where people may still choose to travel less

The pwGO App which was launched late last year is already up and operating for use on mobile devices, and will enable you to continue ordering product under Level 2, 3 and Level 4 scenarios.

If you don't have the pwGO App loaded and want to know more please contact your Plumbing World sales representative or local branch manager — both groups are available by mobile phone or email — to enable the service you require.

We are also on track for pwGO Online (the online programme to replace the existing tradepass trade portal) to go live in April.

Developed utilising the same technology as the App, pwGO Online is super user friendly, will enable you to easily search for product including photographs and product specification information, order product from Plumbing World online from your computer, as well as provide your invoice statements and product catalogue information.

With both of these technologies you are able to order product for delivery direct to your workshop or construction / plumbing site — no travel by you or your tradespeople required.

If you wish, you can also order the product and have it ready for pick up from your local branch without having to come in and pick the items yourself.

Thank you for your support of Plumbing World and let's continue to work together through these challenging times to ensure your co-operative continues to be strong and resilient through the months and years to come.
