The 28th of September marked the 55th birthday of NZPM, so it was indeed pleasing to reflect on the continued evolution of the co-operative with the opening of our fantastic new Plumbing World branch in Kumeu, West Auckland a few days earlier. The modern efficient outlets that we've recently opened like Kumeu, Bream Bay (Ruakaka), Queenstown and our new Distribution Centre in Wiri, are all testament to the strategic direction the co-operative is taking to support our members at a local level, alongside the range of digital and technology initiatives that we've been progressively introducing.

On that digital front, the success of our new pwGO mobile app has been really pleasing, with a great initial uptake prior to its full national launch at the beginning of October. With continued refinements to pwGO over the next few months. I'm sure we'll see more and more customers and shareholders taking advantage of the efficiencies it offers to their businesses, and both the board and management are really excited about the other future technology initiatives we've got in the pipeline.

In parallel with these initiatives we're also studying ways to increase our range of own brand and exclusive products, as these help to protect our future, and they also offer greater margin opportunities for both the

co-operative and for our members. With the recent introduction of our TIVA brand for back of wall products to complement our existing LeVivi front of wall catalogue, we're actively looking at growing both our exclusives range, and also our own brand offering in conjunction with our supply partner Aquasource in China. Plumbing World have partnered with Aquasource for over 10 years now, and some of our members will have met their principals John Beith and Andy Shen when they attended our AGM in August. The Board met with John and Andy earlier in that day, and both companies see many great opportunities to continue to build on the existing relationship for mutual benefit.

Earlier this month I had the pleasure of attending our third annual Young Plumber of the Year competition final and awards evening in Hamilton, and Andrew Bright from Warwick Kirwan Plumbing in Rangiora was the deserving winner. To be fair, all of the finalists were exceptional, and great ambassadors for their companies, and with the skills shortage we're currently experiencing in our industry it's really encouraging to see these future leaders emerging every year. Both the Young Plumbers Club and the Young Plumber of the Year competition have now firmly established themselves as industry leading initiatives, and

they sit comfortably with our co-operative ethos to provide continuing education and training.

Staying on the theme of member education and training, we've recently announced the first of our NZPM Business Training days. These are free one-day training sessions exclusively for our shareholder members, and they cover a range of useful business tips including Credit Control, Marketing, Technology, HR, H&S, Procurement, Governance and Finance. - Four year fixed dividend period 5.5% p.a.

We continue to encourage investors to consider investing for fixed term periods of two, three and four years. All existing Redeemable Preference Share investments continue to default to the quarterly rate and can be redeemed quarterly.
